



EARLI Oeuvre Award 2015

The Oeuvre Award is given at each Biennial EARLI Conference to a living recipient in recognition of a broad range of achievements in the field of learning and instruction including excellence in scholarship and research as well as contributions.

Eligibility

Members nominating a particular candidate should ensure that the candidate fits the following criteria:

- Active EARLI Membership of EARLI
- Member of EARLI for at least ten years
- Cannot be an actual EARLI Executive Committee member
- Actively participated at EARLI conferences
- An outstanding academic career with a substantial contribution to educational research

Deadline

The deadline for nominations is April 30, 2015.

Nomination process

1. Nominations of candidates are made by each Award Oeuvre Committee member who nominates minimum 4, maximum 7 candidates.

2. The nomination should include the following materials

- An Electronic Form of Nomination briefly describing:
 - ✓ Personal information about the candidate (name, position, nationality)
 - ✓ The reasons for the nomination
 - ✓ Academic merits of the nominee
 - Contribution to educational empirical or theoretical research
 - The candidate's contribution to EARLI
 - The candidate's major career landmarks
 - A list of her/his major publications

3. Selection criteria

- a) International/European visibility and reputation
- b) Important research findings (innovative and creative research)
- c) The extent to which the findings have generated research
- d) The significant influence of the nominee's research
- e) High impact of publications by the nominee
- f) Grants and prizes received by the nominee

4. Award Committee

The Oeuvre Award Committee will examine the nominations received. It comprises seven persons appointed by the Executive Committee of EARLI.

Chair: President-Elect

2 members of the previous Oeuvre Award Committee

2 previous winners of the Oeuvre Award

2 other EARLI members

5. Selection of the candidates

Each committee member scores each candidate on a six-point scale: 0 = don't know her/him or would not support her/him at all; 1 = little support, 2 =

modest support, 3= medium support, 4 = strong support, 5 = very strong support. Summing up the scores the committee's actual view is revealed. Seeing the results, members may re-consider their suggestions. The ratings may be repeated several times to see in-how-far the views are converging, and candidates who receive the least support may be dropped.

The form of the final decision can be a simple vote. This step should only take place when there is a high consensus within the committee about the winner of the award, and therefore consistent results can be expected.

6. Informing the Nominated Member

The Oeuvre Award Committee Chair, in the name of the Executive Committee, will inform the candidate that she/he has been nominated for the EARLI Oeuvre Award and will invite her/him to attend the conference.

Winner of the EARLI Oeuvre Award

The winner receives an award.
